WE HAVE MOVED OUR 4-H ENROLLMENT TO ONLINE.

What Do I Need to Enroll: To enroll through the *4HOnline* system, you need a computer or tablet, Internet access, a valid e-mail address and a web browser. Suggested web browsers are: Google Chrome, Mozilla Firefox, and Safari. *Internet Explorer is not compatible with the 4HOnline website.

4HOnline is . . .

The **OFFICIAL** North Carolina 4-H Youth Development Program database for enrolled 4H members and volunteers. This system works as a partnership between the 4-H family and the County Extension Office to manage the 4-H enrollment process and distribute important information to you. By allowing you access you can update your club and project information as well as personal information (email, home address and phone). This will ensure that you are properly enrolled in the county program and receive important news and updates such as newsletters, deadline information and leadership opportunities.

North Carolina 4-H officially moved to *4HOnline* on April 1, 2018. And, while we realize that many of our 4-H members and volunteers have completed past year's enrollment (via paper forms) we ask that you take a few minutes now and create a family profile within the *4HOnline* system. 
Fun Show

Livestock Poster Contest

Contest Rules

- 1. Open to all youth ages 5-18
- 2. Limit one poster per exhibitor.



- 4. Poster must include livestock related content and be on standard sized poster paper. Examples include, but are not limited to: breed identification, diet, meal preparation, cage maintenance, poultry showmanship, and parts of the animal. The content should be age appropriate.
- 5. Poster must be completed by the youth who entered the poster. Minimal parent involvement for 5-7 year old age group is acceptable.

Groups by age:

Clover-Bud (age 5-7) Junior (ages 8-10)
Intermediate (11-13) Senior (14-18)

Posters will be received in the 4-H office Friday, May 31st by 5:00pm

- All exhibitors must register their poster. Posters will be on public display, so please make sure the information used is accurate. Please cite sources if applicable.
- The participant does not have to be present for submission of entry for judging. Limit one poster entry per exhibitor.
- Posters will be judged the week of June 3rd and will be on display at the Livestock Show and Sale. Posters will be released after the Sale.

Ribbons and premiums will be awarded for the 1^{st} , 2^{nd} , 3^{rd} place poster in each group.
